Registration Information

This has been very well received by the schools, students, coaches and parents in the past and we are delighted to run the programme again this year, in 2010. This will be a live in Sports Clinic at Lincoln University during their "mid term break" from June 24th to 27th inclusive. This Sports Academy is based and run at the Lincoln University-Recreation Centre. The University has employed various coaches thus being ideally set up to deliver a quality three days.

The athletes will be exposed to professional coaches, sports medicine personnel and nutritionists. Such insights will empower and motivate them to take greater responsibility for their own preparation in order to obtain maximum performance when involved in their specialist sports.

The camp style will foster social interaction as they will be training, competing, learning, living and socializing together. The students will also experience a taste of University study; explore the campus, and in doing so heighten their awareness of the benefits of a life after school in such an academic and sporting university environment.

The proposed structure is to have 35 students in total representing the four selected sports for this year. The sports are Athletics (Field), Cricket, Netball and Rowing.

Accommodation This is on Campus at Lincoln University.

Transport Hired vans and private car if needed. Leaving after school on Thursday June 24th -from the SBS Event Centre (Stadium) at 4.10 pm.

Selection Criteria Includes:

- Student's performance & achievement record
- Consultation with sport, coach, school. If any needed
- Year level

Cost per Student

The associated fee is \$190 (as for 2008 & 2009) With sponsorship this will cover all costs except their pocket money and the \$15 for Friday nights 10 Pin Bowling.

Sponsorship traditionally comes from Trust Aoraki and The Southern Trust and it heavily subsidises the student costs. The Registration Fee (\$190) and the sponsorship cover the cost of the coaches, Lincoln University admin, accommodation, travel and a key note speaker. A signed entry form is a commitment to attend so applications for reimbursement for any late withdrawals will ONLY be considered if a medical certificate produced.

Naturally I will be delighted to report an "action replay" this year where all students are excellent young ambassadors of family and school.
